UDCC Members Reports - All Consortium members submitted their brief reports in writing (EC-2016-18). Radoslav Maslik reported for Slovak National Library (SNL). He pointed on the importance of UDC online tools for Slovak librarians who are required to provide UDC numbers for all their books. The New Slovak UDC Online is delivered free of charge and is used by all type of libraries. Upon its release SNL organized a workshop. They are looking forward to the release of the new version of the UDC MRF 12. They would like more detailed place subdivision for Slovakia to be introduced in UDC MRF and have provided an alphabetical list of places to be introduced. Marie Balikova reported on behalf of Czech National Library (CNL). She started her report by thanking I. Cordeiro and A. Slavic for the efforts put into reorganizing the UDCC office and UDC products over the past five years and to Chris Overfield for his software support and for providing an up-to-date UDC Online service. She reported that the new Czech UDC Online which is available free of charge, is used by 840 librarians. In Czechia the most important support to libraries in terms of subject access is provided through the subject authorities by the CNL which contain subject headings and UDC notations. In Czechia libraries use three types of UDC scheme: Conspectus, an abridged selection of UDC numbers and standard UDC numbers. Changes in UDC represent a challenge as they may affect and have to be implemented on all three levels of UDC application and in this process it would be most helpful if UDC Online would provide information about cancelled number redirections that is currently missing. Ana Lopez reported on behalf of AENOR who in 2015 and 2016 updated all their products and issued three editions: complete edition in 3 volumes, abridged edition and Spanish UDC Online. She provided sales figures and explained their extensive marketing activity for these editions. Marat Biktimirov reported on behalf VINITI which maintains a high level of activity when it comes to UDC updates. They have recently published a subject-alphabetical index to the 4th full Russian edition. The year 2016, however was marked by the mapping project and enriching VINITI database with mapping data between UDC and all other subject indexing vocabularies of relevance for the research community in Russia. The project is planned to be extended to mapping to other classification systems such as DDC and subject categories of Scopus and Web of Science. A. Slavic summarised the report by Irena Sešek on behalf of National and University Library in Ljubljana which contains information about their own UDC online system and continuous activities in UDC training. Lidija Jurić-Vukadin (not present) submitted a written report on behalf of the National and University Library in Zagreb, which was also summarized by A. Slavic. The Croatian UDC Online was released for sale in summer 2015. However, due to the harsh economic situation in the country the sale is insufficient to cover the costs National Library has towards the Consortium. They have made the decision for 2017 to follow the Czech and Slovak model and they applied to their funding body to financially support publishing of the UDC Online which would be free for all libraries in Croatia.
